

## Transcription Practice Exercise 4—Hindi

Hindi is an Indo-European language of India. The type of Hindi heard on this tape is Telegu-accented, with comparatively pronounced retroflexion and breathy voice. The speaker is Mr. Peri Bhaskararao.
