Directions and notes

- Develop an **OT** account of Samoan stress.
- There are a lot of loans in here, to get long monomorphemes, but assume that they are just like native words w.r.t. stress.
- **Use feet.** It is up to you to decide what is the correct footing of each surface form.
- You'll want constraints MAX-MORA and DEP-MORA.
- Make sure the candidates in your tableaux have enough information shown to evaluate the constraints. For example, if ONSET plays a role in your tableau, be sure to include syllable boundaries in the candidates. Draw in all foot boundaries in all candidates.
- Include as an **appendix** your footings of all the data. You can just print out the data, draw in the feet, and staple that to your writeup.
