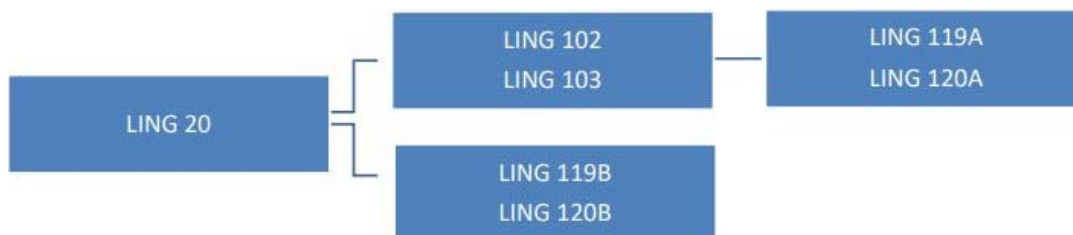

HONORS PROGRAM IN LINGUISTICS

Departmental Honors is an excellent opportunity for those students who are considering graduate school, and is awarded upon graduation to students who maintain a GPA of 3.6 or higher in their junior and senior years, and who earn a grade of “A” in LING 198AB or 199. Courses 198AB and 199 provide opportunities to engage in independent research and write a paper that can be submitted to graduate admissions committees.

Qualified students may be nominated by a member of the faculty to the faculty at large for the award of Highest Honor on the basis of a piece of research in Linguistics completed at UCLA.

SPECIALIZATION IN COMPUTING

Students in the major may graduate with a Specialization in Computing by:

- 1) Satisfying all the preparation for the major and major requirements; AND
- 2) Completing **PROGRAM IN COMPUTING 10A, B, C** or **COMPUTER SCIENCE 31** and **32**; **MATH 61**; **LINGUISTICS 185A**, and **ONE** course selected from **LINGUISTICS 104, 127, 132, 165A, 165B, 180, 185B**. The two upper division linguistics courses can satisfy requirements for both the major and the Specialization in Computing.
