PREPARATION FOR THE MAJOR

LINGUISTICS 20 | Introduction to Linguistic Analysis (5)

Must be passed with a letter grade of C or better prior to beginning upper-division coursework in the major.

ENGLISH 4W | Critical Reading & Writing (5)

or **ENGLISH 4HW** | Critical Reading & Writing (Honors) (5)

ENGLISH 10A | Literatures in English to 1700 (5)

ENGLISH 10B | Literatures in English, 1700 to 1850 (5)

ENGLISH 10C | Literatures in English, 1850 to Present (5)

ELEMENTARY AND INTERMEDIATE LEVELS (SIX TERMS) OF ONE FOREIGN LANGUAGE (0-30)

or

EQUIVALENT TO THE ELEMENTARY LEVEL (THREE TERMS) OF TWO FOREIGN LANGUAGES (0-30)

Students who complete an advanced upper-division language course are considered to have complete the equivalent of whatever course are requisite to that advanced language course (e.g., if students complete German 152, they have automatically satisfied the requirement of the sixth term of work in German).

MAJOR REQUIREMENTS (A 2.0 GPA in linguistics courses is required for the major.)

Students may substitute courses 200A or 200B for 165A or 165B respectively if they receive grades of A in 120A or 120B respectively and have consent of instructor.

HONORS PROGRAM IN LINGUISTICS

Departmental Honors is an excellent opportunity for those students who are considering graduate school, and is awarded upon graduation to students who maintain a GPA of 3.6 or higher in their junior and senior years, and who earn a grade of "A" in LING 198AB or 199. Courses 198AB and 199 provide opportunities to engage in independent research and write a paper that can be submitted to graduate admissions committees.

Qualified students may be nominated by a member of the faculty to the faculty at large for the award of Highest Honors on the basis of a piece of research in Linguistics completed at UCLA.

SPECIALIZATION IN COMPUTING

Students in the major may graduate with a **SPECIALIZATION IN COMPUTING** by:

- 1) Satisfying all the preparation for the major and major requirements; AND
- 2) Completing **PROGRAM IN COMPUTING 10ABC** or **COMPUTER SCIENCE 31 AND 32**; **MATH 61**; **LINGUISTICS 185A**, and **one course selected from 104, 127, 132, 165A, 165B, 165C, 180, 185B**. The two upper division linguistics courses **can** satisfy requirements for both the major and the Specialization in Computing.
